Pamela advocates to raise awareness about liver disease and the importance of organ donation. Pamela learned she was born with alpha-1 antitrypsin deficiency, a hereditary genetic disease, after going to the doctor with flu-like symptoms. The disease had been silently damaging her liver for years, and she was now in an advanced stage of liver cirrhosis with two years to live. Thankfully, through organ donation, Pamela received a lifesaving liver transplant on October 19, 2014.
