Sam advocates to raise awareness about liver health, alcohol-use disorder, and alcohol-associated liver disease. Sam developed alcohol-use disorder, now considered a brain disorder by CDC, in college and has suffered many health consequences as a result. In summer 2021, Sam developed ascites, or fluid in his abdomen caused from a backup of toxins in the liver, and learned he had liver cirrhosis while in the ER. Now, in his mid-30's, Sam's condition continues to worsen, despite being 14-months sober, he lost his job and fears he will soon be homeless.
