Domenic stated, “Growing up, my family and I dealt with an array of challenges stemming from my liver disease, but I also had the good fortune of participating in many of the life experiences that any child or young adult should have, which never would have been attainable for me without the support of my family, friends, and doctors. Last year, after increasing complications in my medical condition and a selfless offer to donate from my brother-in-law, Walker, I underwent a [live-donor liver transplant](#), which has given me back my energy, focus, and ability to truly enjoy and appreciate my life and community.”

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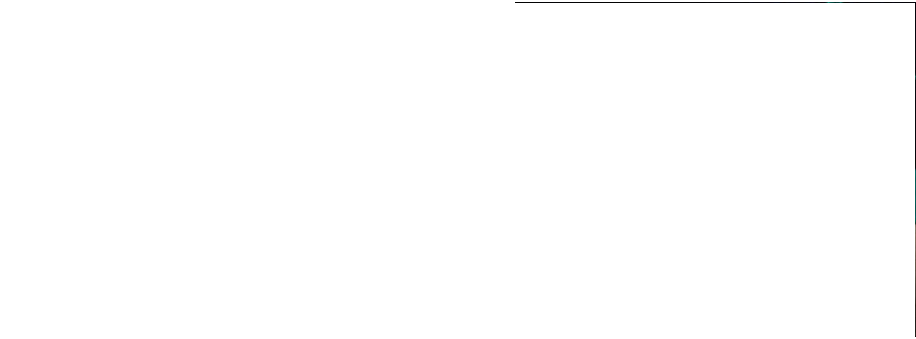
